Apprenticeship Bond of Henry Hoggard, 1803

This bond is mostly typed with information such as names and dates written by hand. I have put the handwritten text in italic format to make it more clear which parts were handwritten. In this document, all "s" were written to look like "f" except for the very first "s" in "State of North Carolina". Source citation is at the end of the transcript.

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA } Bertie COUNTY }

KNOW all men, by these presents, that we *Whitmell Swain William Swain and Simon Powell*

are held and firmly bound unto *Timothy Hunter*, Chairman of the County Court of Bertie, and his successors in office, into the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Pounds Currency, of the State; for which payment, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally by these presents : Signed with our hands, and sealed with our seals, this δ^{th} day of *August* Anno Dom. 1803.

THE condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the County Court of Bertie, hath this day bound *Henry Hoggard* -- an orphan of color to *Whitmell Swain* – to learn him the art and mistery of a shoemaker now if the said *Whitmell Swain* –

Master as aforesaid shall not remove, such orphan out of the County of Bertie, and shall produce the said apprentice before this Court, whenever required, and also produce (hime or her) at the expiration of the time (of his or her) time of service, then this obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
