Factors that can contribute to population changes between census years:

- Increase can be caused by a larger number of births than deaths
- Increase can be caused by newly freed slaves moving into the area, especially if the growth was before 1830
- Increase can be caused by migration into one county from another
- Decrease can be caused by more deaths than births
- Decrease can be caused by migration from that particular county to another North Carolina county
- Decrease can be caused by migration from North Carolina to another state
- Decrease can be caused by county boundaries changing
